

Will in a Box: Another tool for landowners

- Not everyone is comfortable working with attorneys
- Many tribal citizens don't have money for an attorney
- Landowners may not be familiar with the will-writing process
- Pro Se = Do It Yourself
 - Answer the questions privately
 - Print a document that can be signed, witnessed and notarized

Will in a Box: A resource for land professionals

- Provides an introduction to the will writing process and certain requirements
- Can be shared with landowners
- May also serve as an intake tool
 - Landowner prepares necessary information and answers questions to the best of their abilities
 - Document can be edited directly with the client/landowner



How It Works

- Gather information about you, your family, and property
- 2 Answer questions about who you want to give your property to.
- B Download and print your Will.
- Read your Will. Get legal help. Sign your Will. Store your Will somewhere safe.











The Indian Land Tenure Foundation (ILTF) and Montana Legal Services Association (MLSA) created this program to help Native Americans living in Minnesota, Montana, and Oklahoma write their own Wills. This program can help you create a valid Indian Will so you can decide what happens to your land after you pass. What happens to your land should be your decision.

Before you get started, here are some tips on using this program.

- . This program will create an Indian Will based on the answers you provide in this interview. You can download your Indian Will after you finish the interview.
- After you download your Indian Will, you'll need to sign and store it. The Will you download from this program will include a cover sheet with more information on how to properly sign and safely store your Will.
- . Maximize this window to the full size of your screen so you can more easily see all of the questions.
- . Use the scroll bar on the right scroll to up and down to see all the interview questions. When you have answered all guestions on a page, click "Next" at the bottom of the page.
- . If you need to erase an answer press the small "x" to the right of the question.
- . When you finish the interview, you will close out of this program and go back to the LawHelpInteractive.org website where you will have the options to download your form, save your answers, or go back and edit your answers.

What If

Disaster Provision



Important: You can add a disaster provision to your will in the event that something happens to all of your heirs. For example, if everyone named in your will was on the Titanic and nobody survived.

Since you can only give your Indian trust land to other Indians or the tribe, we'll ask you two questions. First, we'll ask who you want to give your Indian trust land to in the event of a disaster. Then, we'll ask who you want to give your non-trust property to in the event of a disaster. You may choose the same or different people in both questions. Just make sure that who you name to receive your Indian trust land in the event of a disaster is eligible to own Indian land.


You have completed the interview.

It is a good idea to **Save Your Answers** in case you made a mistake. After you have saved your answers, press the Download Your Form button to download your Will in Microsoft Word document.

If you made a mistake, you can go back to the questions by pressing Edit Your Answers.

Your form will have instructions on how to execute and store your Will and Testament to make it valid and keep it safe.
